

PROCEDURE TO FILL COUNCIL VACANCY (LESS THAN ONE YEAR LEFT IN OFFICE)

1. Send Notice of Appointment and Special Called Meeting Announcement City legal organ on Tuesday, July 31, 2007. Ad to run in the Wednesday, August 1st edition legal section.
2. Application packets available at City Hall and via City web site from Monday, August 6 – Friday, August 10, 2007.
3. Qualifications:
 - (1) Completed application packet (affidavit, application questions, and financial disclosure statement)
 - (2) Minimum Age – 21 years old
 - (3) Must be registered to vote
 - (4) City residency requirements – six months
 - (5) Must be eligible to hold office
4. A special called meeting will be held on Monday, August 13th at 6:30 p.m. to conduct interviews. All applicants will be interviewed in public.
5. The interview process will be conducted as follows as outlined in City Ordinance Section 2-22 (3-8):
 - (3) During the week following the acceptance of the applications on a date and time set by the mayor, the city council shall interview all of the applicants in a public meeting. The interviews shall consist of an oral presentation of no more than five minutes made by each candidate to the city council and no more than two questions from any single member of the city council to each applicant.
 - (4) After all of the interviews are completed, each member of the city council shall rate the four applicants of whom he or she would like to have as a finalist for the appointment. The council members shall give a rating of "4" to his or her favorite applicant, a "3" to his or her next favorite, and so forth. If there are only three or four applicants, then the city council shall rate only two such applicants. If there are only two applicants, then the city council shall exclude this vote and proceed on to the procedure set forth in subsection 2-22(6).
 - (5) The four applicants who receive the highest aggregate points shall be the four finalists. If more than one applicant ties for the fourth highest aggregate points, then all of those applicants who so tied shall also be included as a finalist. If the city council is only selecting two applicants to be finalist as provided in subsection 2-22(4), then the same procedure as set forth in this section shall be followed, but for only two finalists as opposed to four.
 - (6) The finalists shall be further interviewed by the city council. After the interviews are completed, the mayor shall instruct the city council to rank each of the finalists in writing

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by assigning the number equal to the number of finalists for his or her favorite finalist (e.g., if there are four finalists, then the favorite would receive a ranking of "4"), a ranking of one less than the number of finalists for his or her second favorite (e.g., if there are four finalists, then the second favorite would receive a ranking of "3"), and so forth so that a numerical rating is given to each finalist. The finalist with the highest aggregate score shall be appointed as a council member for the vacant seat. In case there is a tie for the finalist with the highest aggregate score, then the mayor shall instruct the city council to vote publicly between the finalists who tied with the highest aggregate score. In the event the city council divides its vote equally between these finalists, then the finalist who received the highest aggregate score next to the two finalists who tied for the actual highest aggregate score shall be appointed to the city council. In the event of a tie for the next highest aggregate score, then the procedure set forth above shall continue until a finalist is selected to by the city council to fill the vacant seat.

- (7) All written votes shall be counted by the city manager and city attorney.
- (8) All written votes shall contain the name of the voting council member and shall be maintained following the meeting by the city clerk. All written votes are open records.

DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Sec. 2-21. Reserved.

Sec. 2-22. Procedure for appointing council members or mayor.

In the event that city council is authorized to appoint an individual to fill a vacancy on the council, the following procedure shall be followed:

- (1) Within five days of the occurrence of a vacancy on the city council, the mayor shall declare that a council seat is vacant and shall direct the city clerk to publish a notice in the legal organ of the city that the seat is vacant and that the city will accept applications from all citizens who are legally eligible to hold an elected council position.
- (2) Applications shall be accepted by the city clerk beginning Monday following the date the notice set forth in section 2-22(a) is published. Applications shall be accepted for one business week from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday unless such week contains a legal holiday in which case applications shall be accepted on the remaining business days of that week.
- (3) During the week following the acceptance of the applications on a date and time set by the mayor, the city council shall interview all of the applicants in a public meeting. The interviews shall consist of an oral presentation of no more than five minutes made by each candidate to the city council and no more than two questions from any single member of the city council to each applicant.
- (4) After all of the interviews are completed, each member of the city council shall rate the four applicants of whom he or she would like to have as a finalist for the appointment. The council members shall give a rating of "4" to his or her favorite applicant, a "3" to his or her next favorite, and so forth. If there are only three or four applicants, then the city council shall rate only two such applicants. If there are only two applicants, then the city council shall exclude this vote and proceed on to the procedure set forth in subsection 2-22(6).
- (5) The four applicants who receive the highest aggregate points shall be the four finalists. If more than one applicant ties for the fourth highest aggregate points, then all of those applicants who so tied shall also be included as a finalist. If the city council is only selecting two applicants to be finalist as provided in subsection 2-22(4), then the same procedure as set forth in this section shall be followed, but for only two finalists as opposed to four.
- (6) The finalists shall be further interviewed by the city council. After the interviews are completed, the mayor shall instruct the city council to rank each of the finalists in writing by assigning the number equal to the number of finalists for his or her favorite finalist (e.g., if there are four finalists, then the favorite would receive a ranking of "4"), a ranking of one less than the number of finalists for his or her second favorite (e.g., if there are four finalists, then the second favorite would receive a ranking of "3"), and so forth so that a numerical rating is given to each finalist. The finalist with the highest aggregate score shall be appointed as a council member for the vacant seat. In case there is a tie for the finalist with the highest aggregate score, then the mayor shall instruct the city council to vote publicly between the finalists who tied with the highest aggregate score. In the event the city council divides its vote equally between these finalists, then the finalist who received the highest aggregate score next to the two finalists who tied for the actual highest aggregate score shall be appointed to the city council. In the event of a tie for the next highest aggregate score, then the procedure set forth above shall continue until a finalist is selected to by the city council to fill the vacant seat.
- (7) All written votes shall be counted by the city manager and city attorney.
- (8) All written votes shall contain the name of the voting council member and shall be maintained following the meeting by the city clerk. All written votes are open records.

Sec. 2-23. Salaries; reimbursements.

- (a) The mayor shall receive \$9,000.00 annually which shall be paid to the mayor in 12 equal monthly installments. This compensation is subject to all federal, state, and local taxes.
- (b) The council members shall receive \$6,000.00 annually which shall be paid to each council member in 12 equal monthly installments. This compensation is subject to all federal, state, and local taxes.
- (c) The mayor and council members are entitled to reimbursement for all expenses incurred in the exercise of their responsibilities on behalf of the city. The mayor and council members shall follow the procedures established by the city for all city employees for reimbursements.

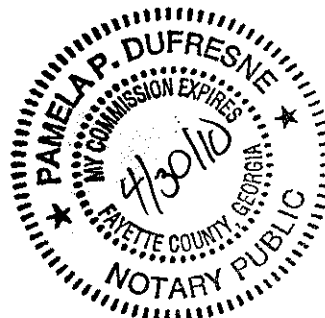

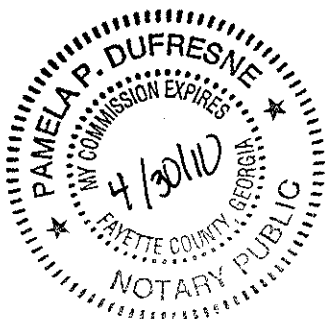

4) Have you ever attended any Council meetings? Yes, numerous over the last 18 months.

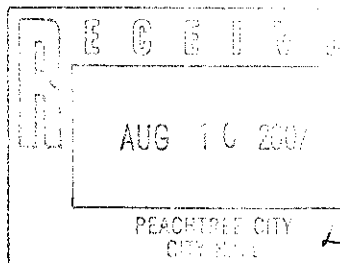
5) Have you ever attended any Planning Commission meetings? Yes, quite a few during the last year.

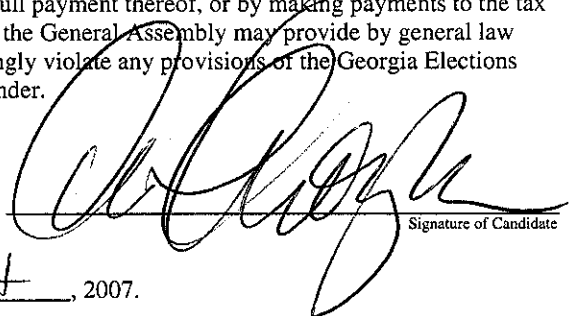

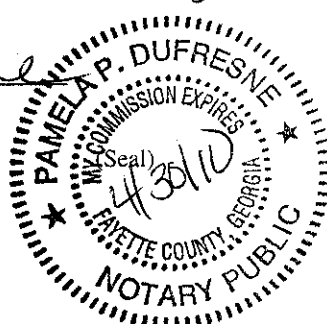

I enjoy challenges and would relish the opportunity to work with the Mayor, City Council members, as well as local government to help shape a positive future for Peachtree City.

It is my philosophy that it is important that city government doesn't create obstacles for residents and local businesses. Instead, government should be a partner with its citizens to create constructive change according to the will of the people. It is equally important that we foster a positive relationship with the county and the state; that we work together with both for the enhancement and prosperity of our city. 3) Since deciding to apply for this position, what research have you done?

Since my decision was not made until Thursday the 9th of August I have not the opportunity to accomplish any research, other than reading the local paper. However, as the Mayor and Council know, I ran for office previously and acquired much information through research and knowledge at that time. Through my prior research I have taken the liberty to attach my position on Annexation and Business Development. Please see below.

> ANNEXATION

Annexation is the most important matter our City has ever faced; this is a decision that will determine how well Peachtree City is positioned to face the next fifty years. Dating back as far as 1985, the City's Land Use Plan recommended that the land-locked property located in unincorporated Fayette County between Peachtree City and Tyrone "be examined for possible annexation by Peachtree City."

Our city was founded in 1959. Forty-six years later we are seventy-five to eighty-five percent complete and soon will be entirely built out. During its history, Peachtree City has continually gotten better and the rest of the world has pretty much gotten worse. The next Mayor will have the great responsibility for maintaining a great community and properly preparing our City for the next fifty years.

It is important that Peachtree City fulfill its potential as a community by being just the right size, providing a variety of housing alternatives, by remaining a safe community. It has to have good schools, plentiful jobs, churches and recreation, places to eat and shop.

All of these things are important because I know that as the world around us grows more chaotic, most of us would find leaving Peachtree City more and more painful.

Now we face a critical decision as to what our city will look like, not only for the near future, but for many, many years to come. This is a decision about what kind of city we will live in and what kind of a city we will leave to our children and grandchildren. It's not difficult to see why fulfilling Peachtree City's master plan is so important!

It is imperative that we move forward with a comprehensive plan for the West Village.

Ps. Please continue and read on the information to follow; the Advantages of Annexation and the Drawbacks of Not Annexing

Advantages of Annexation

1). The west side of town becomes a fifth village with the same "look and feel" as the rest of Peachtree City, including schools, recreation, green space major City facilities and excellent transportation patterns.

- 2). The City has a long-term balance between population and infrastructure leading to financial efficiency and the ability to deliver maximum services with the lowest possible tax and sewer rates.
- 3). Completion of the new parkway up front will provide short-term relief to the congestion on Hwy 54 West and at the 54/74 intersection by providing a significant alternate route.
- 4). The City will receive over \$2,000,000.00 in impact fees which will provide entirely for the infrastructure needs of the new Village and contribute to the cost of new amenities available to all of us.
- 5) The School Board will receive significant help in meeting the future needs of our children.
- 6). Annexation ensures that the west side residents will always receive the best emergency services--and that they will pay their fair and proportionate share for these services.
- 7). An environmentally sensitive area will be protected from the effects of haphazard development , both during the construction period and long term.
- 8). The potential to eliminate railroad grade crossings in the northern part of the City, which will improve safety and potentially lead to the elimination of train whistle noise for all the residents in that area

Drawbacks of Not Annexing

- 1). West side development will be the typical balkanized development, with no cohesive road pattern seen in most other cities.
- 2). Road access points to new development will range from poor to potentially dangerous.
- 3). The short and long term pressure on Hwy 54 West and on the 54/74 intersection is precluded.
- 4). Once piecemeal development begins, a western bypass of the 54/74 intersection is precluded.
- 5). No land, no amenities, and little financial assistance is provided to any government entity.
- 6) Puts a significant number of septic tanks (400-530) into an environmentally sensitive area.
- 7) Creates a short term and long term emergency services problem of serious proportions
- 8). Significantly pressures the School Board, gives them no help, and leaves them with only unpalatable choices such as temporary classrooms and redistricting.
- 9). Foregoes \$1.5 to \$2.0 million dollars in Peachtree City fees.
- 10). Fails to balance the City's population with its infrastructure and financial needs in the long term.
- 11). Puts long term pressure on the City recreational, governmental, and cultural facilities without

corresponding tax revenue.

12). Forever leaves the west side of Peachtree City as the "other side of the tracks".

13). With no annexation the area would have little connection to Peachtree City because of lack of access. They would however, use the City's recreational facilities and would see us as their commercial and business area.

> BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

Although most citizens are aware that Peachtree City is almost built-out residentially as per the city's plan, did you know that we have only reached about 75% of the city's business model? You may ask, "Why is this important to me?" Due to the fact that we are almost built-out residentially our tax base will no longer significantly grow from additional new homes. There will be no impact fees for new homes and the amount of money the city raises on permit fees for new home construction will decrease. As the city ages, money has to be spent to maintain it. This will cost money - tax money. This can only mean an increase in taxes; but only if things do not change.

As of 2006, ten of the top fifteen businesses which pay taxes in the county are located in Peachtree City. These ten companies add over 3.4 million dollars in tax revenue to our tax base and make up 8.3% of our total digest. While this is a good start, this is simply not enough. I'll explain.

We have built a planned community with almost 90 miles of tree-lined golf cart paths, a beautiful amphitheater, a world class tennis center, and a top notch aquatic center. Our public recreational facilities are some of the best in the state. This was by design. Besides adding to our wonderful quality of life, these amenities help entice quality companies to locate their businesses in Peachtree City. The presence of these companies adds to the tax digest and helps defray the residents' tax burden. That is a critical part of our planned community. This all sounds great, right? Who would not want quality companies locating in our town? It is the council's job to assist in the process to bring in large companies into the business areas and into the industrial park.

There are over 235 acres of available land use in the industrial park. Let's do the math. The land use ordinances permit about 8000 square feet of usable space per acre. If we multiply 8000 by 235 acres, we have 1,880,000 sq. ft. of potential usable space to construct buildings and other improvements. These improvements are taxed and add to the tax digest of our community. Also, the businesses located in these buildings bring with them additional jobs and other sources of tax revenue. I believe a conservative number of employees for these new businesses is about five (5) employees per 1000 square feet. If this is the case, completing the business development per the city plan would add about 9400 new jobs to Peachtree City. These companies and their employees increase our tax base and help reduce the current tax burden placed on all of us. In addition to the increased property tax digest, the increase in jobs helps in other ways. The additional employees will surely spend money in our restaurants and shops which results in more sales tax revenue. More businesses also means more overnight stays in our local hotels with an increase in the hotel tax revenue. Plus, since the residential portion of Peachtree City is virtually completed, these revenues should come without the increasing our city population.

Peachtree City needs a city council that understands businesses. I am a businessman understands business. In less than eight years I, with the help of an outstanding general manager, operation managers, and staff, have been fortunate enough to open three health clubs and have bought out six other clubs along the way. We have to create and maintain a positive environment for over 11,000 members. My business employs over 135 people. Managing such a payroll requires strong fiscal management and control. I have the business skills to make informed decisions. By working together with the Mayor and other Council members we can bring more quality companies to our great city.

8) If appointed, do you have any goals you would like to accomplish?

Yes,...find and create new avenues to increase the revenue base for the city, thus offsetting taxes. Taxes (cost) will continue to increase, the most efficient method to compensate is to establish and create additional revenue. Just one potential idea (there are several others) is a "Real Estate Transfer Fee" for new residents (this will not effect current residents).

Real Estate Transfer Fees

Chances are when you mention to someone that you live in Peachtree City you are quickly asked about the golf carts, the recreational paths, and all of the green space which we enjoy in our city. It's our image. I, for one, am proud of that image. However, I'm not proud of the current deteriorated state of our cart paths. Likewise, I'm not happy with the worn look of our parks and recreational fields. I'm very concerned that we have not set aside any meaningful green space acreage in our town under our previous mayor's administration.

To maintain the recreational path system, the City has to spend money. To improve our parks and get them back to the condition we all expect, the City has to spend money. To acquire more green space, the City has to spend money.

I have a better idea of how to raise the funds needed to maintain and improve the paths and green space - the very essence of Peachtree City. No one wants to have the government raise their property taxes, nor to have their property value reassessed simply to achieve a higher tax base. Neither do I. So I looked at other cities with amenities similar to ours to see if they had figured out a way to pay for such needed improvements without placing an additional burden on the current citizens and taxpayers. It seems that Hilton Head Island in South Carolina has done just that.

Hilton Head Island assesses a real estate transfer fee of one-quarter of one percent of the sales price of a home payable by the buyer. The city uses 100% of this money to pay for additional green space and beachfront to preserve the unique character of that town. The local ordinance has survived legal challenges in court. Hilton Head Island is receiving those fees and now has the money to keep Hilton Head looking the way its citizens want it to look.

Peachtree City can do the same and what's more important, it's fair. You and I already paid for the current green space, recreational paths, parks, and most of the recreational facilities. That cost was built into the price of new homes or paid for through past tax dollars. The

developers of Peachtree City constructed much of the recreational path system as mandated by the City. Likewise, the developers set aside much of the green space and parks as required under our ordinances. The cost of building the paths and preserving the green space was added to the price of your home. Also, the City began collecting impact fees from developers in the early 90's of which a part of those fees went to pay for the recreational facilities. Those impact fees were passed down to you as a price of the new homes. Additionally, the City spent tax dollars to buy some of the park land and to build the sports fields now used for soccer, baseball, softball, football, etc. That money was spent long ago. You and I paid for it.

New residents move to our City in large part because of the great lifestyle we enjoy. A tremendous part of that lifestyle is our recreational facilities, our path system, and our green space. Is it wrong to ask these new residents to help pay for those amenities? I do not think so.

Thus, I am proposing that Peachtree City pass a real estate transfer fee ordinance which requires buyers to pay one quarter of one percent of the purchase price of the home. I am also proposing that 100% of the fees raised be placed in a special fund which can only be used to maintain our recreational paths, keep our green space beautiful, improve our parks and recreational fields, and purchase additional green space to preserve our unique lifestyle. The money cannot be used for anything else. That fund will serve three purposes. First, it gives Peachtree City a much needed source of revenue to maintain the green spaces which define our town. Second, it relieves the burden placed on the general operating fund so that taxes can be lowered or stabilized. Third, it pays for the maintenance and improvement of our public green spaces and path system which will help retain the quality of our lifestyle and value of our town. Based on the current home sales over the last two years, this fee would raise an additional \$350,000.00 to \$400,000.00 annually for our city.

To make this idea work, Peachtree City will need the cooperation of local and state officials. I will strive to gain such cooperation. I have already met with some of these officials to discuss my idea. I believe that we only have to ask for their help.

My pledge is to work hard to keep Peachtree City looking like the place we all chose to live and being the place we want to raise our families. My pledge is also to do this without constantly going into the citizen's pocketbook. The real estate transfer fee allows those individuals who wish to enjoy our lifestyle to help pay an equitable share of the cost of that lifestyle. It's fair and it will work.

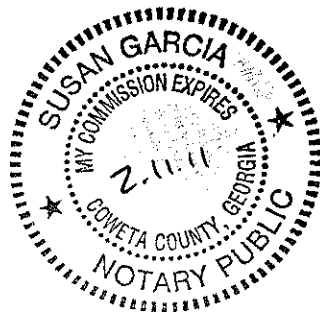

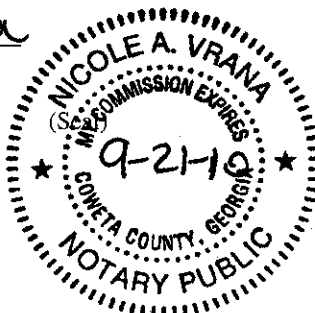

Ever since I was in grade school I have actively read the newspaper and other media outlets in the locality in which I was residing. Moving to Peachtree City I found that there was not a daily paper dealing exclusively with Peachtree City and the surrounding area. This lack of convenient and timely information led me to begin attending PTCCA meetings and Council meetings. I have also attended a Planning Commission meeting as well as the Comprehensive Plan kickoff meeting. Through conversation, web searching, and meeting attendance I have been able to keep up with local events. I have not done any additional research since deciding to apply but rather continued my information gathering. I have read the Land Use Plan and the current Comprehensive Plan as well as the recent Comprehensive Plan addendum passed by Council in late May. I believe that this prior research as well as my attendance at recent Council meeting will aid me in making a smooth transition into the position.

I have attended the majority of Council meetings over the last 5 months. If I have not attended I have read the Agenda packet and followed up with conversation and/or media coverage on the outcome of events. If I am attending I also read the Agenda Packet to make sure I know of the items to be discussed. Additionally I have spoken at multiple council meetings most recently offering input on the Council and Mayoral raises.

graffiti and trash throughout the system need to be continued and some proactive measures need to be considered to assist in these efforts. I believe we also need to look to our Fire and Rescue units to make sure that they are able to maintain the high quality of service they currently provide.

Secondly I have observed the pressures of growth outside our borders are playing an increased role in the life of our city. My goals in this area to listen to our residents and make sure that the majority support the major tenets of the planning documents such as the Village Retail centers, traffic around our city not through it, and maintaining a natural look and feel to the community. Traffic is certainly a component of this goal and I believe that the council made the correct decision to postpone the TDK extension.

Finally I would like to improve the quality of life for all of Peachtree City. I believe this can be accomplished by providing a comprehensive recreation plan, improved public safety and factoring in the effect on quality of life into the decision making process. Improving the quality of life certainly is woven throughout goals one and two but I feel strongly that improved quality of life in Peachtree City is why I moved my family to Peachtree City and bought a house in the city as opposed to the county.

City Council Candidate Application Questions:

- 1) Why do you want to serve in this position?

I want to serve as an appointed councilman because I care very much about Peachtree City and believe I can do a lot of good for the city. I am well connected in the community to both young people because of my age as well as older people throughout the city and county; including elected officials and business owners. I believe the relationships I have developed with these individuals will assist me greatly in this leadership position. I am sure you are already aware that I intend to be a candidate in the upcoming election. I understand your concern that by appointing a candidate you would effectively be setting up an incumbent. However, I do not want to wait until the election to begin serving. I feel there are some pressing issues that need action to be taken immediately. Therefore, I am seeking the appointment despite any advantage it may give me in the election. I hope this opportunity will serve as my "proving ground" in which I will earn the confidence of the people as well as the council.

- 2) Detail your community involvement.

It is rather unfortunate but I must say I have little community involvement at the present time. This, of course, is due to the fact that school and the two part-time jobs I work occupy much of my time. As a young person growing up I was heavily involved with my Boy Scout troop, Troop 455 of the Atlanta Area Council. I participated in many community service projects during this time and hope to one day get involved as a scout leader in a local troop when time permits. I understand this position will demand a significant commitment of my time and effort. I am prepared to make the necessary arrangements with my employers to guarantee I can devote ample time and effort to the position.

- 3) Since deciding to apply for this position, what research have you done?

Since deciding to apply for this position I have researched current and former issues facing Peachtree City. I have done this by reading a lot of recent and past news articles to get a good understanding of the issues and develop ideas for how we may approach them to come up with meaningful solutions.

- 4) Have you ever attended any council meetings?

Yes, I have attended council meetings in an effort to learn more about the operation of the council and city government and to gain a better understanding of the issues facing the city so that I may be better prepared for this position.

- 5) Have you ever attended any Planning Commission meetings?

Yes, I have attended Planning Commission meetings in order to achieve better understanding of current and future development issues. Most recently I attended the first in a series of meetings of the Comprehensive Plan Forum.

The number one duty of the council members is to listen and respond to the needs of their constituents. They are voted into office by the residents and must remain responsible to them. With that said, the council members are here to find ways to solve problems facing the city and its residents. They are here to help formulate and approve an operating budget, work together with surrounding jurisdictions to solve mutual problems, ensure oversight and accountability of

those entrusted with taxpayer funds, and to preserve our quality of life so that Peachtree City remains a great place to live and raise a family.

8) If appointed, do you have any goals you would like to accomplish?

Yes, if appointed I do have some goals I would like to accomplish; most important of which concerns public safety. I want to immediately work towards developing a new policy that will allow the city to fill the vacant police officer positions. There is absolutely no excuse for having so many positions vacant for such a long period of time. My ideas include holding a job fair or sending officers to visit local colleges and universities in an effort to dramatically increase the number of applications we receive and recruit cadets. Keep in mind that the process to fill police officer positions takes months. We may be able to get students who will be graduating soon interested in a position and start the application process before they even finish school. This way we may more quickly fill the positions. We must also work to streamline and shorten the very long and tedious application process that currently exists.

Also, I do not agree with Chief Murray's assertion that we must refrain from hiring individuals who have a simple misdemeanor criminal conviction. We do not live in a perfect world and people make mistakes. What's important is that people learn from those mistakes so they do not repeat them. There is such a bad connotation associated with lowering standards. However, when the standards are too high it is a wise and prudent decision to lower them. Furthermore, just about every police agency in the state will hire those who have a prior misdemeanor conviction. It is time for Peachtree City to bring our police department in line with the many other agencies in the state regarding this matter. Failure to do so will result in the continuance of this shortage of officers and jeopardize the safety and security of the residents.

In addition, I will advocate the city to develop a "comprehensive plan" to improve safety and security on the golf cart path system. I think it is unacceptable to suggest we will only be able to add one to three officers to patrol the cart paths sometime in 2008. However, much more can be done than simply adding golf cart and bike police to the paths. The comprehensive plan will include not just police but a whole host of security initiatives. As part of the plan I want the city to develop a better system of identifying the paths. This will enable the public to more effectively report emergencies and public safety to respond to them more rapidly. I want to study putting emergency call boxes throughout the path system because many who exercise on the paths do not carry cellular phones. This limits their ability to report emergencies and jeopardizes their safety. Also, we need to investigate putting closed-circuit cameras in strategic, high traffic areas such as major gathering spots to improve security in these areas.

Because of growing concerns over the future of Peachtree City. And I now have the time and opportunity to serve in a meaningful and productive manner. Meaning I can work with staff, community organizations and residents to identify and develop resolution and/or advocacy strategies for issues. My HOA and business experiences would make me very comfortable and qualified, in this role.

2) Detail your community involvement.

a) Adult Boy Scout leader for approximately six years.

b) 4-H leader for approximately five years. I coached and administered an existing program, then created, administered and coached a successful second program. (won state, national and international titles and produced the state's program Master 4-H'ers, two consecutive years.

c) Dover Square Homeowners Association:

1. Landscape Chairman – four years.

2. At-Large Director – one year.

3. Vice President – one year.

4. President – four years, where I held an on-site meeting with Mayor Brown, concerning Stormwater flooding. Further, I attended the Stormwater public meeting for affected associations, where I noted errors in the maps and assumptions concerning our drainage area. Then, by the chief engineer's request, I held an on-site meeting to review the total area issues. We walked, discussed, planned and re planned solutions for the total area, from Aberdeen Shopping Center to the lake, including The Arbors, Dover Square, The Villas and Tinsley Mill. It is a large and growing complaint that too many important issues are either being decided without sufficient citizen review and comment, or with no review or input, at all. It has resulted in the formation of the Peachtree City Community Association, in example.
- b) Advocacy – An area of growing complaint that too many issues, outside Peachtree City's direct control, are not receiving adequate, if any, advocate presence, from Peachtree City. I.E: Fayette BOE redistricting, which removes students from their communities, development plans of Coweta County, spur rail of CSX and so on. A common complaint is being told it is outside our jurisdiction or automated responses, nothing more.
- c) Employee morale – There is a lot of employee anger over income cuts (which includes benefits). This has resulted, in example, in the threat of a Police Union, to which the basic public response has been the City just won't listen to it.
- d) 74/54 intersection - Studies have already stated the present plan is out of date.
- e) Tree buffers. There has been a declining adherence to concept of tree buffers. A lot of anger over 74 being stripped and sound walls being erected. Which relates back to advocacy and open government.
- f) Golf cart paths – increased security and proper, responsible usage.
- g) Slow down development – Too many proposed new developments at the same time of having unfilled commercial and unsold residential. Use the Big Box ordinance to discourage continued proposals. Resist apartments and high density residential.
- h) Reject requests from Tyrone to tie into the Peachtree City sewage system. Allowing such would enable massive new developments, which Wieland wishes to do, that would further add to traffic problems from highway 74.
- i) In summation – bring back the vision of Peachtree City being a bedroom community of trees, homes and people. We don't want to be Riverdale or the North Side.
