

Transportation Advisory Group of Peachtree City
Meeting Minutes
Tuesday, January 28, 2025
6:30 PM

Call to Order

The Peachtree City Transportation Advisory Group (TAG) met in a special called meeting on Tuesday, January 25, 2025, in the Community Room at City Hall. Chairman Paul Schultz, joining via Microsoft Teams, called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. Other TAG members present were Vice Chair Keith Larson and Alan Reeves. Brian Barta and Public Works Director Jonathan Miller were absent. Assistant City Manager Christopher Hobby also attended.

Minutes

A. January 7, 2025 Transportation Advisory Group Minutes

Reeves moved to approve the January 7, 2025, Transportation Advisory Group minutes. Larson seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

New Business

A. Future TAG meeting topics schedule

They discussed the frequency of meetings, and Schultz said since they were down a couple of members, it might be best to have just one meeting in February with the topic being the display of requiring registration numbers on the front and back of carts. The group agreed that the next meeting would be February 11, then they could decide how to proceed.

Old Business

A. Multi-use Path System Master Plan project ranking Part II

The group then completed the evaluation of various path projects for inclusion on the master plan, which they had started at the previous meeting. They rated each project as a 1 through 10 in two areas: quantity, which consisted of expected traffic volume, and quality, which looked at how the path would be used, such as for a route to school or work or to a village center. Each member stated their opinions on how the path should be ranked, then they decided on a collective ranking.

In addition to paths, they looked at bridges and tunnels, as well as the possible placement of high-intensity activated crosswalk beacons, known as HAWK signals, at several locations. Larson also included major projects listed in the new Recreation Master Plan because those might require new paths and connections within the parks.

With discussion on the list completed, Larson said he would organize the rankings

and get it to Miller for presentation to Council. Schultz suggested Larson first make a final draft and send it around to all members for final comments. That way, Bartal could see what had been decided and add his opinions.

Placement of registration numbers on the front and back of golf carts would be the topic at the next regularly scheduled meeting on February 11, with the second meeting in February cancelled. Reeves said they would need to look at the current ordinance regarding the placement of stickers, and Larson added that he planned to look at other cities and see how they handled registration stickers.

Adjourn

There being no further business, Larson moved to adjourn at 8:11 p.m. Reeves seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
