Minutes of Meeting
November 21, 1996

The City Council of Peachtree City met in a regular session Thursday, November 21, 1996, at 7:00 P. M. in the City Hall Council Chambers.

Mayor Lenox led those attending in the pledge of allegiance. Council members present were: Annie McMenamin, Caroline Price, Bob Brooks, and Jim Pace.

ANNOUNCEMENTS, AWARDS, SPECIAL RECOGNITION

Mayor Lenox presented Employee of the Month award to Matthew Robinson.

Mayor Lenox presented Supervisor of the Quarter award to Bill Weston.

The Professional Volunteer Corps was established. Jim Williams explained the purpose of the Volunteer Corps would be to assist the staff in the review of erosion control plans and the regular monitoring of construction activities. He said they would also assist builders and developers in solving erosion control problems, and to notify the project manager and City enforcement officials of violations. He said the Volunteer Corps would not have enforcement authority but would be properly trained to handle all other aspects of the land development inspection process. Members appointed were: Gene Fritz, Jamey Ormond, Scott Power, Gary Rower, Nick Nasrullah, and Dennis Chase. Phyllis Aguayo volunteered to schedule inspections, keep records and maintain communications between the inspectors, staff and developers.

Caroline Price publicly commended Fire Chief Reed and his Department for the tribute they paid Brother Leach at his funeral. She said the citizens were fortunate to have such a strong Volunteer Fire Department and she was thankful that the citizens of Peachtree City could depend on the volunteers and staff on a daily basis.

11-96-08 Amend Ordinance - Electronic Alarm Monitoring System

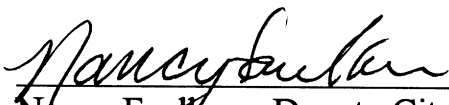
